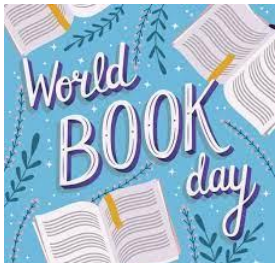
Comic Relief
